

## Chinese202--Intermediate Chinese II

### II. Objective:

This course aims to help students acquire the highest level of language proficiency at Intermediate Chinese II. After finishing this course, students are expected to learn and recognize nearly 700 characters, to master all major sentence patterns, to conduct daily life conversations with native speakers with ease, and to be capable of giving a five-minute speech if asked and writing a statement, letter, or email in one or two grammatical paragraphs. The course addresses goals 1, 2, 6, and 7 of the eight goals that constitute HWS' requirements for a baccalaureate degree.

### IV. Course Requirements:

This course requires students to comply with all instructions given in class and after class. All assignments, typed and written, should be handed in on time, normally in a subsequent class time after they are announced, unless otherwise specified. Regular and punctual class attendance is necessary. Attendance and participation at a two-session language lab weekly is mandatory. Work with Chinese Teaching Assistant, Ms. Wu, to schedule your labs, which will begin in the second week.
