BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

George Maxwell Blackstock Hawley (GMBH), 1870-1941, entered Hobart College with the class of 1892, though he did not graduate with the class. He received his L.L.D. Law from University of Minnesota in 1895, returned to Geneva where he practiced law.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The GMBH papers contain notes, articles, and newspaper clippings generated by GMBH over many years of historical research and writings pertaining to Geneva and the Finger Lakes area. These include handwritten notes, letters, newspaper clippings, printed material and typed manuscripts. The arrangement retains GH's cataloging system wherever possible.

A draft inventory prepared prior to 1991 is used in this finding aid to locate materials. Two boxes, 12x10x15, containing original materials are located in the Vault; three boxes, 12x10x15, containing photo copies, but keeping the original order, are in the Geneva mss collection, located at the end of the Geneva mss collection.
