PROVENANCE

The Robert Huff papers, containing newspaper articles, letters, note cards, and magazine articles pertaining to Elizabeth Smith Miller, her daughter Anne Fitzhugh Miller, the Political Equality Club of Geneva and the women's suffrage movement were collected by Huff for the purpose of writing articles about the Millers. He gave them to the Archives of Warren Hunting Smith Library in the summer of 2001.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Robert Huff papers contain numerous newspaper articles, letters, magazine articles, and note cards that span from 1900 to 1920.

The largest part of the collection is made up of newspaper and magazine articles. These articles were pulled from *The Geneva Daily Times*; *The New York Times*, *The Delineator*, and *The Woman's Journal*. These articles all pertain to Elizabeth Smith Miller, Anne Fitzhew Miller, the Political Equality Club, and the Women's Suffrage Movement, the majority of which are related to the Political Equality Club and the Women's Suffrage Movement.

A collection of Anne Millers note cards is included from between 1897 and 1901.

Biographical Information

Robert Huff joined the Hobart William Smith Faculty in 1962 and was promoted to full professor in 1975. Before teaching, he received a BA in 1952 from Boston University with distinction in history; an MA from Tufts University's Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy in 1953, and a Ph.D. from the University of Rochester in 1967.

His scholarly contributions include reviews and articles to the Encyclopedia of American Biography, The Encyclopedia of World War One, Pennsylvania History, New York History, and the American Historical Review.

Huff spent 30 years teaching history at Hobart and William Smith Colleges retiring in 1992. In 1999 Robert Huffs dedication to the school and students was when he was awarded the Distinguished Faculty award.
